

Crisis, Global Policymaking and the North American Upheaval Symposium

Recent political developments in the United States have marked a new phase of the ongoing crisis of the liberal order, impacting institutional frameworks that used to ground global policymaking. From aid to trade to defence to climate change, and from international institutions to Canada, Europe and the Global South, policymaking processes and potential futures have experienced profound disruptions.

We believe that significant opportunities exist to historicise and theorise these changes in a comparative, interdisciplinary way, exploring the intellectual developments that have driven them, their deeper historical roots and relevant historical analogues, and the continuities and discontinuities they entail in policymaking. We invite contributions that explore one of the following themes:

- What policy failures have led to this iteration of the crisis of the liberal order;
- What new policy ideas, configurations and processes have emerged from it;
- What potential policy solutions might exist to address it.
