What is a Future Leader Experience?

A Future Leader Experience is an experiential programme which takes you out of the classroom and into the city to explore leadership in practice. You will take part in challenging discussions with leaders and go behind the scenes of organisations, gaining hands-on experience through exploring the challenges they face.

Who is the programme for?

The programme is open to students who are part of the School of Social and Political Sciences at University of Glasgow.
