## Step-by-step guide

- 1. Select the assessment that you wish to create a rubric for.
- 2. Consult the course/programme ILOs and ascertain which ILO(s) the assessment should be assessing.
- 3. Brainstorm the assessment topic: list all of the criteria that occur to you.
- 4. Now try to group them together. Ensure that you have clear links to the academic assessment objectives and outcomes.
- 5. Consider pre-empting other issues when setting up your rubrics. Maybe your students need prompts to remind them about proper formatting, or correct referencing, for example.
- 6. Write a clear statement for each criterion you have chosen.
- 7. Articulate levels of quality for each criterion. Bloom's Taxonomy can be a useful way of sketching out each level of performance.
- 8. Test the rubric ask a colleague for feedback, or test it with your students prior to handing out the assignment.
- 9. Implement, and evaluate.
